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Eligibility criteria




- European dimension to the project
- Basic rule: 3 partners (independent legal entities) from 3 different Member States (MS) or Associated Countries (ACC)
- Special cases:
 - SME-targeted: specified part of the total estimated EU contribution to SMEs (15%, 30% or 50%)
 - SA (Support Action): minimum 1 partner
 - SICA (Specific International Cooperation Actions): 2 partners MS or ACC, 2 partners ICPC (International Cooperation Partner Countries)

Additional demands in annual Work Programme!

Flexibility = small consortia wanted!



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Different roles



Coordinator, partner no 1

- communication with European Commission
 - acts as intermediary for any communication between the EC and the beneficiaries
 - represents the beneficiaries towards the EC
- Scientific manager/coordinator of project and research tasks
- might be the **project manager** as well

work-package leader / task leader

- supports coordinator / responsible for their WP
- management tasks
- research or coordination tasks

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What makes a good consortium?





A good consortium...



- best partners for the job
 - scientific excellence
- experienced coordinator
 - scientific reputation
 - interpersonal skills
- multi-disciplinary approach (fulfill topic requirements)

A good consortium... (cont.)



- complementary partners (all provide added value)
 - different institutions (academia industry/SME NGO, patient organizations, consumers, patients...)
 - different disciplines
 - different competences / skills
 - SME participation **often mandatory**! (15% up to 50% of the total estimated EU contribution)

Additional criteria:

- project experience (national / European)
- interests / motivation
- reliability, team player communicative competences


