Erasmus Mundus

Action 1

Joint Masters and Doctoral Programmes

- implemented by EU and non-EU HEIs
- full-study scholarships for students; grants for visiting scholars

Action 2

Partnerships

- EU and non-EU HEIs
- scholarships for short-term or degree-seeking student mobility at a range of levels, and for staff

Action 3

Promotional projects

- raise profile of European higher education
- tackle challenges of international higher education cooperation

Erasmus Mundus Calls results 2012

- 30 Masters Courses (15 new, 15 re-selected)
- 9 Joint Doctorates (EMJD)
- 53 Action 2 partnerships
- 9 Action 3 promotion projects
- 3 National Structure information grants

Scholarships 2012

Joint programmes:

- 1923 EMMC student scholarships
- 469 EMMC scholar scholarships
- 298 EMJD doctoral candidate fellowships

Action 2 partnerships:

- 2011 selected partnerships plan 6,380 scholarships

Scholarships on offer 2013

- Joint programmes starting in 2013-2014:
 - 138 EMMCs, 43 EMJDs offering scholarships
- Action 2 partnerships offering scholarships:
 - All 53 partnerships selected in 2012 (together plan over 8,300 scholarships)
 - Many of partnerships selected in 2011 will select a second (and possibly third) cohort of students

Action 3 projects to date

- 75 promotion projects 2004-2012
- 10 information projects managed by National Structures (selected 2010-2012)
- Summary results and outputs of Action 3 projects (by theme, by region) available on EM website

- Exploit synergies, identify good practices across EM projects
- Five clusters
 - Sustainability
 - Employability
 - Recognition
 - Regional (Asia)
 - Thematic (climate change)
- Survey – Workshop – Guidelines – Survey report
- Results on EM site



Intra-ACP academic mobility scheme

Intra-ACP academic mobility scheme

- **Partnerships** of universities from ACP countries (Lot 1 Africa, Lot 2 Caribbean and Pacific)
- Partner universities from ACP countries only (possible for technical partners from EU)
- **Scholarships** for ACP nationals to study agreed Masters and Doctoral programmes offered by partner universities

Intra-ACP Call results 2012

- Second Call for Proposals: EUR 12m
- 5 partnerships for Africa
- 1 partnership for Caribbean & Pacific
- These 6 partnerships plan mobility for over 700 masters students, doctoral candidates and staff
- 8 running partnerships for Africa, 2 for C&P

- More budget per partnership (5 Africa, 1 C&P)

Tempus Programme aims

- Aims to support modernisation of HE institutions, systems and programmes Neighbourhood countries, Russia and Central Asia
 - Joint Projects: implemented at institutional level to reform curricula, improve university governance or enhance links with society.
 - Structural Measures: implemented at national level for the development and reform of national higher education structures and systems.

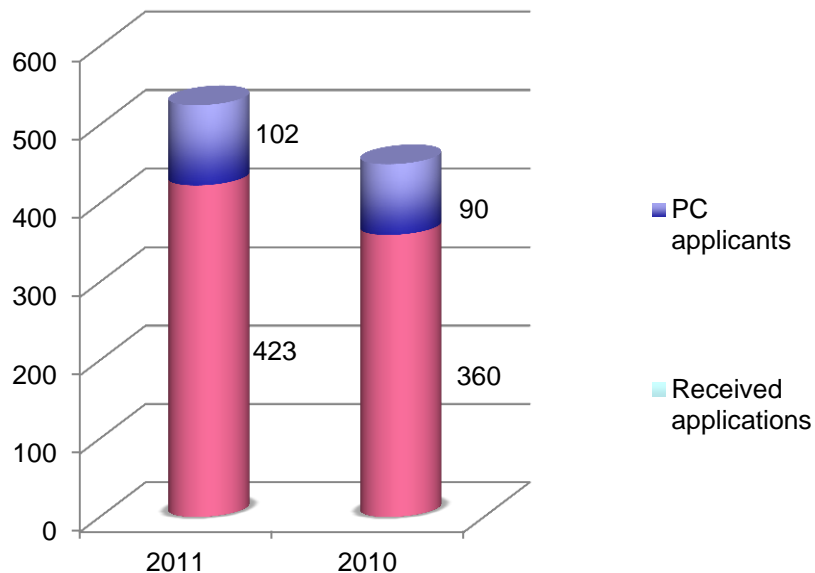


Tempus thematic areas

- **Curricular Reform**
- **Governance Reform**
- **Higher Education and Society**

Success rates

- 525 proposals in 2011
- 102 selected projects
- Success rate = 19%



Funding available

- Grants: € 500 000 to € 1 500 000
(Minimum Co-financing = 10%)
- Project duration: 24 or 36 months
- 6th Call for Proposals (budget € 84 million):
Publication Oct 2012 - deadline in Feb 2013

Three Bilateral cooperation programmes

- **ICI-ECP (Industrialised Countries Instrument-Education Cooperation Programme):**
EU-Australia/Japan/New Zealand /Republic of Korea
- **EU-US ATLANTIS (no more calls foreseen)**
- **EU-CANADA (no more calls foreseen)**

Common Characteristics

- **Development of common study programmes+mobility (Double/Joint Degree and/or Joint Study programmes)**
- **Bachelor or Master degree, or VET, but no PhD**
- **Lump sum for administration and development work**
- **Flat rate grants for Student and Staff Mobility**
- **Balanced activities and shared responsibility**
- **Co-funding by the EU and the partner country 50% + 50%**

ICI – ECP 2012 Call

- **New call is foreseen to be published in November 2012**
- **Planned deadline for applications 15/05/2013**
- **Budget : from EU side approximately 2.45 M€**
- **Plan to fund 5-9 cooperation projects**
- **Negotiations with Partner Countries under way: AUS, JPN, NZ, ROK**
- **Cooperation projects: EU and one Partner Country**
- **Two types of projects:**
 - **Joint Mobility projects**
 - **Joint Degree projects**

Preference is planned to be given to:

- **Double or Joint Degree projects**
- **Mobility projects in the area of VET and to projects offering work placements or training experience**
- **Projects planned to start October 2013**

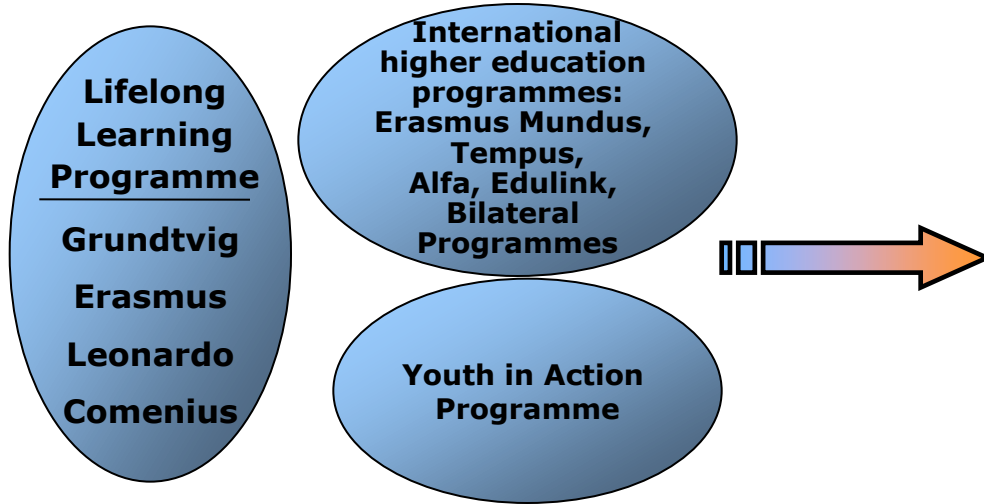

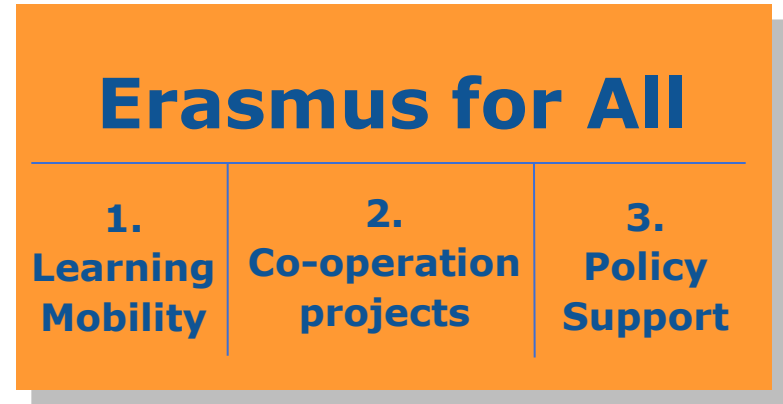


A streamlined architecture : 3 Key actions

**Total budget: € 19 billion over 7 years (+ 70%)
incl 1,8 bn for cooperation outside EU (+10%)**

Erasmus for All: the international dimension

- ❑ ***Incorporate all existing international higher education related programmes*** (*Erasmus Mundus, Tempus, Alfa, Edulink and cooperation with industrialised countries*) to:
 - *put an end to the current fragmentation*
 - *enhance the global visibility and impact*
 - *increase efficiency*

- ❑ ***Accommodate different objectives:***
 - *Attractiveness of European Higher Education Area*
 - *Excellence*
 - *Solidarity/ Equity*

- ❑ ***Integrate the youth international dimension***





Key Action 1 : Learning mobility of individuals

Key action 1:

Learning mobility of individuals

International dimension:

- **1) Degree mobility:** Higher education mobility for EU and non-EU students and staff through funding of **excellent joint Master degrees and related scholarships**
- **2) Credit mobility** at all levels based on bilateral agreements between universities.



Key Action 1 : Learning mobility of individuals

- ❑ **Degree mobility:** continuation of current action 1 of Erasmus Mundus, joint Masters and related scholarships based on excellence. Joint Doctorates moved to Marie Curie Action. Managed by EACEA. Open to the world. Open for joint calls.
- ❑ **Credit mobility:** full integration intra-EU/ international. Incoming and outgoing mobility based on university agreements. For students and staff. Managed by National Agencies. Open to the world, based on EU external policy priorities.



Key Action 2 : Cooperation

Key action 2:

Cooperation for innovation and good practices

International dimension

- 1) Special action for **Neighbouring countries**, combining capacity building and mobility. Joint projects based on multilateral partnerships between higher education institutions from the EU and Neighbouring countries.
- 2) **Capacity building in Higher Education:** partnerships with HEIs from Asia, Latin America and Africa.



Key Action 2 : Cooperation

- ❑ **Special action for Neighbouring countries** (and non participating Enlargement countries): joint projects between EU and partner countries for capacity building (curriculum modernisation, staff training, modern teaching, governance, etc) with in-built mobility. Based on integration of Tempus and Erasmus Mundus (action 2)
- ❑ **Action for Asia, Latin America, Africa:** joint projects between EU and partner countries (incl. Triangular cooperation) for capacity building, based on experience from Alfa and Edulink



Key Action 3 : Support for policy reform

Key action 3: Support for policy reform

International dimension:

- Policy dialogue with selected third countries and international organisations, to i.a. foster exchange between parties on issues of common interest
- Promotion events, international fairs...
